1. THE INTERNATIONAL BARENTS SECRETARIAT

1.1. INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the International Barents Secretariat (IBS) in Kirkenes, Norway. We hope that this introduction and other information given in this Handbook will be of use to you during your stay in Kirkenes.

1.2. PURPOSE AND TASKS OF THE SECRETARIAT

The Agreement on the Establishment of the International Barents Secretariat was signed at the 11th BEAC Ministerial session in Rovaniemi on 15 November 2007 in order to make the Barents cooperation more coherent and efficient. The purpose of the Secretariat is to provide administrative, informational and technical support for the multilaterally coordinated activities within the framework of the Barents Euro-Arctic Council and the Barents Regional Council and to serve thus both the governmental and regional levels of the Barents cooperation. One of the tasks of the Secretariat is to ensure the continuity of operational work of the Barents structures where the governmental and regional chairmanships are rotating biennially.

2. PRACTICAL INFORMATION

2.1 WORKING HOURS

Office working hours are generally from Monday to Friday from 08:00 – 16:00.

2.2 WORKING LANGUAGE

The working language of the IBS is English.

2.3 INCOMING AND OUTGOING MAIL/FAX/E-MAIL - TELEPHONES

Every employee will get his/her own E-mail account (<u>firstname@barents-council.org</u>), PC and telephone.

2.4 ARRIVAL TO KIRKENES

In March 2020 travel restrictions related to Covid-19 pandemic were introduced at all national borders in the Barents region. Some categories including employees and students were still allowed to enter Norway following certain entry rules. 2.5 ACCOMMODATION

In the beginning of your stay and if needed, employees may use the premises allocated to the interns of IBS. The premises provides an own bedded room in a student house with access to wi-fi. The accommodation includes bed sheets, pillows and blankets, bathroom (shared), washing machine, iron and kitchen with kitchenware and refrigerator. You are supposed to rent a flat/room at your own expense for the duration of your contract with the IBS.

2.6 RENTING AN APARTMENT

In Kirkenes there are many offers for renting apartments for incoming residents. Adverts may be found eighter on social media or on the websites of the real estate agents. You might get a tip from the office staff. Investing in the apartment is also an option when you are staying a longer period. For employees of IBS, the IBS will assist in search for a suitable apartment. 2.7 PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Kirkenes is well connected by direct daily flights with Oslo (SAS, Norwegian) and with many smaller airports in Northern Norway (Widerøe). Kirkenes is also a turn-around stop for the Hurtigruten coastal cruiser. There used to be a daily bus shuttle between Murmansk and Kirkenes, especially popular on weekends among shoppers. Snelandia bus company is providing transport services both inside the city and connects Kirkenes with other settlements and cities in Finnmark. Here are some useful links:

2.8 HEALTH SERVICES

There is a recently built regional hospital in Kirkenes. A health care centre is located inside the Amfi shopping centre (just two blocks away from the office). On the ground floor of the same shopping centre there is a pharmacy. Behind the Amfi one can find a drop-in Covid-19 testing station open on weekdays. There are several dentists in town.

2.9 BANKING

There is only one bank office physically located in Kirkenes (Sparebank1). Please note that opening a bank account in Norway takes time for a foreigner but the IBS will assist you. It is possible to use the most common debit/credit cards as a payment method in many shops in Norway. Upon agreement in the beginning of your stay salary and renumeration of travel costs can be paid on your existing bank account in your home country.

2.10 TAX

Salaries of the employees at the IBS are subject to national taxation in Norway. However, some exceptions are applied to foreign nationals, who have one of the positions of the Permanent Staff (about exemptions from taxes and duties pls. read Article 10 of the Host Country Agreement <u>link</u>). The Permanent Staff of the IBS is also entitled to use the ID and petrol cards, issued by the Norwegian MFA. IBS will assist you in getting the tax card from the local tax office.

2.11 SCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN

It is possible to place your child(ren) in one of the municipal kindergartens and schools in Kirkenes, after being admitted. Pls. check the availability of such place prior to your child's arrival to Kirkenes. You may get advice from the experienced office staff.
