

## **BEATA Webinar on Railway and Logistics in Barents**

## 29 April 2021 1000-1230 (CET)

Rail transport is an important part of the transport system in the Barents region, and has an important role in the transport of large volumes of goods, mainly over longer distances. Rail transport helps to meet the need for cost-effective, safe, and sustainable transport and is an energy-efficient alternative for long distances. Customers in need of transport of large volumes use rail transport in specially adapted systems where entire trains transport one group of goods, such as timber or ore. In both cases, the railway's low unit costs contribute to reduced costs for Norwegian business and industry. Trains with containers are effective and can compete with road transport taking all kinds of products.

The railway system connects the Barents region and provides links to the European lines as well as to Asia. There are some important cross border rail connections in our region, some of them involves change of gauge. What is the status for these important locations on the rail network and are the bottle necks properly addressed in the national plans?

The BEATA Webinar will highlight the railway's role as carrier of goods in Barents. We have invited experts from the railway administrations as well as experts and stakeholders on logistics to provide insight and knowledge about current development and plans. The BEATA Webinar is open for all with interest in development of transport in Barents.
