- New Barents HIV/AIDS Programme 2015 2019 is in place

- Goal: To secure HIV prevention and care, reduce the morbidity and mortality caused by HIV and to minimize the impact of HIV and AIDS on individuals and society as a whole within the Barents Region.
- Raises the connection of alcohol and HIV (risk-taking, impact of alcohol on ARV effectiveness, impact of alcohol on adherence to treatment)
- Five priority areas for the region:
  - HIV prevention in key groups
  - HIV prevention in the general population including at workplace
  - Integrating alcohol and HIV prevention and control programmes and policies
  - Strengthening national coordination and capacity to respond HIV and AIDS
  - Strengthening international cooperation in HIV/AIDS prevention and control

### **Overview of HIV situation**

#### Russia 2015

According to the Northwest District AIDS Centre, St. Petersburg, in 2015, 6,440 were diagnosed with HIV. Transmission routes in NW Russia in 2015 were: IDU – 25,4%, heterosexual contacts – 42.8%, men having sex with men – 3,2%, mother-to-child – 0,6%, not known – 28.0%. The biggest age group among newly infected was 30 to 40 years old. According to experts, the penetration of the **second HIV wave** to the Northwest Russia is rather a reality than a possibility

#### Finland 2015

Totally 174 new cases, of whom 98 of foreign origin; 7 via drug injecting; 119 sex contacts (47 MSM); and 44 with the route not established. Males – 131, and females – 43. 24 died, of whom 6 from AIDS.



### **Overview of HIV situation**

#### Sweden 2015

Quite stable situation during the last 5 years with about 450-470 reported cases per year. >80% of all cases are infected abroad (before immigration or during visits abroad) and the endemic cases (people infected in Sweden) are decreasing during the last 5 years, probably due to high coverage of ART (>90% of all diagnoses cases are on effective ART). HIV was the only infection on decline last year.

### Norway 2015

HIV rate dropped among the MSM. Home testing is planned for introduction nationwide by NGOs. The 90-90-90- target is likely already reached. The PrEP will be in place in 2016 and provided free of charge. Double infection TB and HIV rather rare – 8 cases in 2015. Patients with double infection are treated for both infections by same infectious disease department.
