Logical Framework Workshop on planning of a new tuberculosis programme, in Repino, Leningrad Region (9-11 June)

Proposals on further steps:

1. Finland proposes that the new TB Programme would be working under the Barents JWGHS. The Programme would have tight connections to the NDPHS activities through the expert groups, namely a newly established Expert Group on Primary Health and Prison Health Systems and Expert Group on HIV/AIDS and Associated Infections.
2. This would be a framework programme which would have several projects under its umbrella. One project could cover one or several objectives of the programme. Projects could be Norwegian-Russian, Finnish-Russian, Swedish-Russian, purely Russian and also multilateral, if financing allows.
3. The participants proposed to create a steering committee for the new Barents TB Programme. It would have a Russian chairman with two Co-Chairs/coordinators. Dr. Zaza Tsereteli, International Technical Advisor of the Expert Group on Primary Health and Prison Health Systems, is proposed to be one of the Coordinators. Another Coordinator will be from Russia. **The Russian Barents Regions are asked to give their proposals on the Chairman and the Russian coordinator before the JWGHS meeting.**
4. The Steering Committee would meet maximum twice a year and follow the working principles of the Steering Committee of the Barents HIV/AIDS Programme. The main task of the Steering Committee would be monitoring of the Programme implementation and reporting to the JWGHS. Financing for the meetings would be applied either as a project application, or the Nordic chair country together with Russian co-chair region of JWGHS would finance these meetings.
