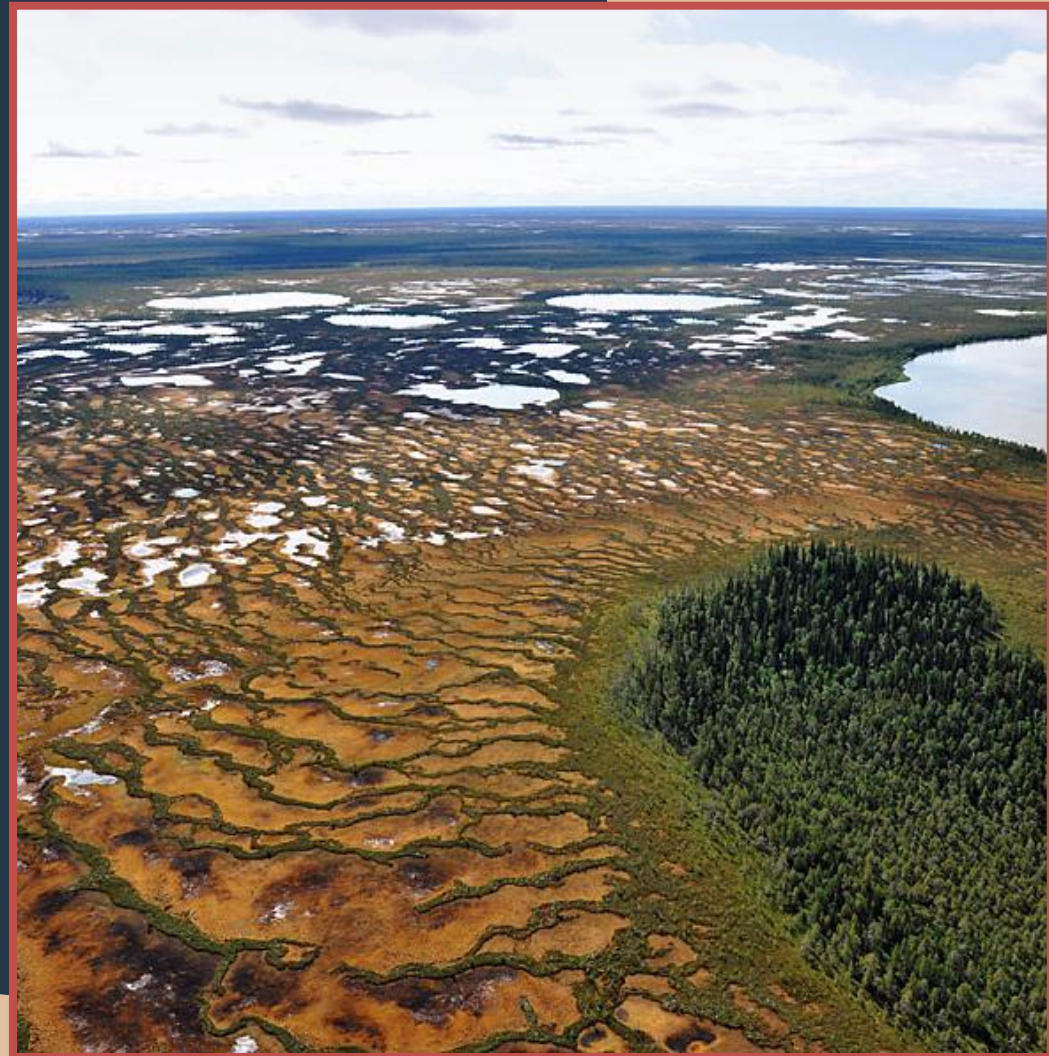

BPAN — Barents Protected Area Network in 2011-2017

BPAN projects promoted the establishment of a representative protected area network in the Barents Region to conserve biodiversity of boreal and arctic nature, primarily forests and mires.

- implemented in 2011-2014 and 2015-2017 by national and regional nature conservation authorities, scientific institutes and NGOs
- funded by the Nordic Council of Ministers, governments of Finland, Sweden and Norway, and the WWF Barents Sea Office
